If you don't have this note, your child will be marked absent. <p><u>CLASSROOM UPDATES</u></p>

Pre- K: Ms. Keen's class we completed a lot of fun activities. In science, students completed an experiment with Mrs. Mann's 4th grade class and learned about dissolving! We took marshmallow peeps and placed them in different solutions (water, soda and vinegar). Mrs. Mann's class helped us write and discuss what we thought might happen to the peeps and then observed the results for 2 days! This week students are going to be talking about Earth day, recycling, and rainbows. Students have been practicing writing the upper and lowercase letters. Mrs. Lowrey's class went out to the courtyard to weed the PreK garden and plant different seeds including sunflowers, corn, marigolds, and gourds. They also watched the life cycle of a Ladybug.

Kindergarten: In Math students are learning about shapes and their attributes. Students are exploring shapes that roll, stack and slide. Students are also comparing 2-D & 3-D shapes. In ELA students are becoming better readers as they begin learning long vowel words and silent e. In writing students are working on their opinion pieces and learning the importance of understanding the difference between a fact and an opinion. In Science/Social Studies students are discussing ways we can take care of the Earth in preparation for Earth Day this weekend. They are learning ways that we can "reduce, reuse and recycle. "

1st Grade: For Science, students just finished their weather unit and made their own weather instrument project. For math, students continue to learn about place value while adding tens and ones, and subtracting tens. For writing, students have been researching an animal of their choice (habitat, food, appearance, babies, etc.).

2nd Grade: Second grade is loving being back at school! The students are finishing up their Informational Writing pieces. In ELA and science students are learning a lot about Earth Day and ways to protect the Earth and keep it clean! The students are also super excited to participate in Autism Acceptance week and are learning about different ways to be accepting and kind to many different types of people.

3rd Grade: 3rd grade is excited for spring and warmer weather. Students are reading about trees and the classic novel, *Charlotte's Web*. In social studies students are studying communities and different cultures. In science students are learning about structures of life. In writing students are beginning an informational writing unit and can't wait to write about a topic they have researched.

4th Grade: For ELA, Mrs. Praul's class is reading *Esperanza Rising*, Mr. Fortugno class and Mrs. Caruso's class are both reading *Crash*, Mrs. Palmer's class is reading *Front Desk*, and Mrs. Mann's class is reading *Fourth Grade Rats*. For Math, students are working on Understanding and Comparing Decimals, as well as Geometric Measurement. For Writing, students are

	<p>working on their final writing piece of the year, informational writing. For Science, Praul's and Palmer's students are exploring the concepts of energy and change, waves, and energy transfer. Caruso, Mann, and Fortugno are focusing on the concepts that organisms need energy and matter to live and grow, and that living organisms depend on one another and on their environment for their survival and the survival of populations.</p> <p>5th grade: Students are working on Earth day activities for science. It will include us taking a virtual field trip to the Earth Day Network office, as well as doing a research project about some of the impacts humans have had on the planet. For Social Science, students are learning about the Constitution and how it became the model for individual freedom and responsibility. For ELA, they are reading a novel set in America in the 1940's and focusing on Character development, foreshadowing, author's style, theme.
